General Information

Item	Description			
Course Length	The course runs over nine-weeks (with a one week study break in the middle of the term), plus a two week review period for marking and feedback.			
Course Description	Seeking the next step in your education career? Whether you're looking to become a mentor teacher for the first time, or want to boost your existing educational leadership skills, gain the tools you need to effectively support and mentor the people in your kura school.			
	With our Te Whare Wānanga o Waitaha University of Canterbury education experts, you'll learn more about education and leadership, including how to facilitate positive outcomes, te ao Māori mentoring principles, and growing empowering mentormentee relationships.			
	Whether you're in early childhood, primary or secondary education, you can use these educational leadership skills to support Pre-service, Tōmua Provisional and Tūturu Full Practising teachers, as well as laying the foundation for your future in education management.			
Learning Outcomes	 By the end of the course, you will have learnt: The difference between mentoring and coaching How to effective mentoring relationships A Māori worldview of mentoring and how the principles of Te Tiriti influence relationships How to facilitate difficult learning conversations How to create SMART goals 			
Learning Impact	Participants will be provided with the knowledge, skills, and tools necessary to effectively support and guide Pre-service, Tōmua Provisional and Tūturu Full Practising teachers, as well as laying the foundation for their future in education management. Participants will develop the ability to apply effective mentoring strategies and reflect on their own mentoring practices. The course has the potential to improve the quality of teaching and teacher preparation, benefiting students, teachers, and the broader education system.			
Delivery	This course is 100% online, which means you can log on when it suits you each week to fit learning into your life, so long as you meet assessment deadlines. You can work through the course content at your own pace, or you can follow our recommended study plan outlined below in the course schedule.			
Estimated hours per week	We estimate your engagement will be about six – seven hours a week over the nine learning weeks (excluding the one-week study break).			



Qualification	Micro-credential: This is a standalone course that recognises the achievement of specific skills, experience, or knowledge.			
	Upon successful completion of the course you will be issued a digital badge to recognise your learning achievements. This can take up to 2 months to be delivered after the marking and feedback period.

How the course works	You'll need to work through this course sequentially. It's divided into five modules that run over nine weeks (excluding the one-week study break). Use the navigation block on the left to move from one module to another. Each module includes the following material: • Specific learning outcomes and module introduction. • Topic content using a range of media. • Activities to apply what you've learnt and/or discuss with your peers and facilitator. • A 'temperature check' survey to seek your feedback about your experience as a learner. Learning online doesn't mean learning alone. Our courses have been designed to enable a cohort community so you can learn and grow from each other's experience. We also have a facilitator for each course who is there to offer support as you work through your learning, in addition to our Enrolment Advice and Online Learning Support teams.			
Assessment	To receive a passing grade for this course, you need to have attempted all activities and to have received an overall grade of at least 50%. For more details see the assessment schedule below.
